High Sheriff of Cambridgeshire

David Way is the current High Sheriff of Cambridgeshire, the latest in a line stretching back over 1,000 years. The High Sheriffs are appointed by the reigning monarch for just one year; over their long history they have had a close connection with the maintenance and enforcement of law and order and the system of criminal justice. David feels very strongly that modern day slavery is a terrible evil which cries out for more awareness and attention, and his Cambridgeshire Business Conference is a key part of that initiative.

David and his wife Rosemary have lived in their 16th century yeoman's house in what was Huntingdonshire for nearly 40 years; he studied law at Cambridge and worked in London, specialising in private capital matters for clients from all over the world.

They have two sons— one a lawyer, the other an Anglican priest— and four granddaughters. David is Chairman of the Friends of Peterborough Cathedral and of the charity Art Friends Cambridgeshire, and a Trustee of the Cambridgeshire Police Shrievalty Trust (“the Bobby Scheme”).
