# Employment and Immigration Update





March 2025

The Employment Rights Bill has taken another big step (spring forward!) this month, completing its passage in the House of Commons and now with the House of Lords for their consideration.

Earlier in March the <u>Government published its responses</u> to the first five consultation papers relating to the Bill, together with a lengthy list of tabled amendments.

The Bill was republished on 14 March, when it had its first reading in the House of Lords. A number of key amendments have been made to the Bill, <u>as detailed in our summary</u>. At the second reading of the Bill on 27 March, concerns were raised by peers about the restrictions on the use of 'fire and rehire' tactics and the operation of the new statutory probationary period. It is likely that amendments to these provisions will be put forward at the Committee stage.

As the Employment Rights Bill progresses, the Government has issued a new consultation this month on proposals to introduce mandatory <u>ethnicity and disability pay gap reporting</u> under the promised Equality (Race and Disability) Bill. Read our article for an overview of these proposals.

We also provide a <u>roundup of employment law news</u>, with a reminder of the new statutory right to neonatal care and pay, and the new statutory payments and tribunal awards taking effect in April.


